City celebrates seven graduates of Lean Six Sigma Black Belt training

The Danville Office of Economic Development & Tourism (DOEDT), in partnership with GENEDGE, hosted the Lean Six Sigma Black Belt Certification Training (LSSBB) for professionals and businesses in the city of Danville and jointly owned industrial parks in Danville and Pittsylvania County, August – November. Seven professionals graduated from the course on November 14, 2025.

LSSBB Training equips professionals with the advanced tools, techniques, and leadership skills needed to lead impactful projects that reduce waste, enhance efficiency, and improve quality across operations. Sessions were held at the Institute for Advanced Learning & Research, 150 Slayton Avenue, Danville.

This training was tailored to provide professional development to those in the manufacturing, services, government, education, and healthcare sectors, and other fields. Course topics included advanced statistical analysis, process mapping and improvement, root cause analysis, design of experiments, project management for continuous improvement, control charting, and developing effective strategies for sustainable operational excellence.
